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DIRECTORS NOTES

It might surprise our more loyal patrons to learn that the Town & Country Players have never before staged *The Sound of Music*. Although it seems unthinkable that it has taken us this many years to finally bring this gorgeous piece of theater to our audience, in many ways, the timing could not be more providential. As we enter our 75th Season, our theater community, and the world at large, finds itself faced with unprecedented trials. From the continued struggle to overcome a global pandemic, to a time of political strife and division unheard of in recent memory, there have been few moments that so sorely tried the strength of our communities at home and abroad.

One of the great strengths of R&Hs' musicals is the way they so often insinuate the intimate human drama of their stories against the backdrop of titanic historic moments, leaving us as an audience to contend with the impact that history has on the individual. While many may remember little more about *The Sound of Music* than its collection of uplifting and catchy showtunes and the soft sweeping romance of the Robert Wise film adaptation, the musical itself is suggested by another moment of great historical strife, namely the annexation of Austria following the rise of the Hitler's Third Reich in Germany. While the first act of the piece is blissfully, almost naively unconcerned with the mounting political disaster brewing for Europe at the onset of the 1930s, Lindsay and Crouse's book then plunges us deep into the troubled world of Europe under the threat of totalitarian fascism. The transition is jarring, bleak, and, in the words of Elsa Schraeder, there is seemingly "no way to stop it."

There is a keen sense in *The Sound of Music* of the profound and devastating impact that fascism has on culture and art. The absorption of a plurality of nations like Austria and Poland under the haunting homogeneity of the swastika devastates heritage, national identity, and humanity in the service of hate, domination, and the acquisition of absolute power. *The Sound of Music*, while in many respects falling short of truly indicting the evils of Nazism and the holocaust, instead dwells on the resilient spirit of those who hold true to their core values in the face of overwhelming evil. The rising action of the piece is not a thrilling standoff with jack-booted stormtroopers, but Oscar Hammerstein's final song, "Edelweiss", penned just months before his death, a softly sung ode to a symbol of national culture and identity that refuses to be stamped out by despotism.

As I approached *The Sound of Music*, my thoughts were often with the people of Ukraine, who find themselves contending with an annexation all the more violent and shocking than the Anschluss. In the aftermath of the second world war, the often-quoted refrain was, "never again". Never again were we to allow the power hungry and unscrupulous to ride roughshod over the basic humanity of their neighbors. However, history, as it so often does, seems to be falling into an ugly and familiar pattern. There are some who might think of *The Sound of Music* as a timeless piece, but in 2022, I prefer to think of it as timely. It is an enduring testament to the power that music and art have to combat the evils of fascism and despotism, and the truth that evil will never be more potent than love.

A Note from T&C's President

Welcome to the Town and Country Players' 2022 Season. This represents a milestone year in our history, as this is our 75th season of bringing quality community theater to the Bucks County Area.

Town and Country Players got its start in 1948, with a production of *The Late George Apley*, performed at the Doylestown Borough School. T&C moved to our current location, "The Barn," in 1953, renting the barn until we purchased it in 1962. Throughout the years, we have made many improvements to our space, including air conditioning, catwalks, raked seating, sound and lighting improvements, and -perhaps most importantly - our addition in 2014 which tripled the number of restrooms and added rehearsal space.

That said, T&C is more than just the name and the barn that we perform in. If one looks at our database of past productions, one will find a list of nearly 4000 individuals who have been involved in our productions over the years, from actors, musicians, directors, and producers, to designers, technicians, carpenters, stage crew, and stage managers. This doesn't include those members who have supported us in other areas, including the myriad of business/operational areas required to continuously bring productions to the stage.

Of course, all the effort required to bring a production to the stage wouldn't count for much without the support of our community. From the 400 patrons who came to see *The Late George Apley* in 1948, to the 150 who can fill the house for each performance in our intimate theater today, without our patrons, all those hours and late nights spent rehearsing, designing, building would be for naught.

I also want to thank all those who have donated to T&C over the years. Your generosity has enabled us to keep the lights on, improve our infrastructure, and weather hard times (like the last couple of years).

When we started to plan our 75th season, we decided to focus on large cast, uplifting shows after two seasons impacted by COVID. We also wanted to celebrate our 75th season by selecting shows with a tie to either T&C or to the Bucks County area. While T&C has (surprisingly) never before produced *The Sound of Music*, its tie to Bucks County couldn't be stronger, as the famous Oscar Hammerstein II, creator of the book musical, lived in, and wrote the lyrics to, many of his shows, including *The Sound of Music*, from his Doylestown home. We hope you enjoy our production of the Tony Award winning *The Sound of Music*.
