T&C INSIGHTS...

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I wanted to do this show because I love a good love story and "LOVE LETTERS" by A.R. Gurney is a great love story! In LOVE LETTERS, Gurney takes audiences through the universal aspects of love; selfless, friendship, pragmatic, obsessive, noncommitted, and romantic love. It is love's exploration in Gurney's play that made me consider an exclusive cast of our Town and Country couples. Because of the diversity at T&C, I welcomed all couples to audition, and that's when we welcomed the opportunity to be the east coast premiere for "OTHER LETTERS" by Bryan Renaud and Carin Silkaitis.

As we began the LOVE LETTERS production process, we learned that A.R. Gurney and Dramatist Play Service did not have a plan in place to adapt LOVE LETTERS for future audiences. Through copyright laws and licensing agreements, the play is limited to a male and female couple with no changes to the script. Our lovers' first letter is dated 1937 and between 1937 and 1988 we openly said words of discrimination against individuals, religions, and ethnicities. At some point LOVE LETTERS will be declared politically incorrect and obsolete, and that's sad because all the beautiful expressions of love that are also in the play will be gone, too.

Which brings me to the exciting east coast premiere of OTHER LETTERS by Bryan Renaud and Carin Silkaitis. OTHER LETTERS was written in 2016 and our lovers' first letter is dated 1979. Bryan Renaud and Carin Silkaitis have captured the contemporary love themes that are part of our everyday lives here in the present. The play originally written for same sex couples is adaptable; because, after all, love is universal.

One last thought, in the beginning of Richard Curtis' film *Love Actually*, the Prime Minister character tells us, "... love is everywhere. Often, it's not particularly dignified or newsworthy, but it's always there - fathers and sons, mothers and daughters, husbands and wives, boyfriends, girlfriends, old friends. When the planes hit the Twin Towers, as far as I know, none of the phone calls from the people on board were messages of hate or revenge - they were all messages of love. If you look for it, I've got a sneaky feeling you'll find that love actually is all around."

Both productions are done using the production concept of little preparation and the cast reading their notes, letters and cards to each other and the audience. I invite you to sit back and enjoy our little plays, LOVE LETTERS or OTHER LETTERS or both! We present both plays with lots of love to our supporters and our lovers!!

Jim McIntosh Sound Designer




