T&C INSIGHTS

A NOTE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Three of the sweetest words a playwright can write: END OF PLAY. I say this as a playwright who has reveled in that moment when the final scene draws to its final close... It means a labor of love has finally been born. A piece of art in all its messy glory has been completed and put down on paper. Now what?! And so begins the process that can strike fear in the heart of any playwright—seasoned or novice... The dreaded rewrite.

In some cases, rewiring a play can be very slight and very easy. It has been said that when writing *Blithe Spirit*, Noel Coward completed the play in six days and only dropped two lines of dialogue during the rehearsal process. This, I can assure you, is NOT the norm! For some, the rewrite can be brief. For others, it can drag on for what feels like an eternity. No two plays go through the same process on its journey from page to stage. And that is the beauty of the art form— it's very unique and very personal.

Sharing in that journey is something that is just as unique for everyone involved once the playwright takes that plunge and begins sending it out to theatre companies. The directors, designers, actors and audiences that share in the process of watching a new play come to life are all experiencing the same thing— the first steps in the life of a new piece of art. And what a thrill for the playwright when that work does make that ultimate leap from page to stage!

The Signature Series at Town and County Players was created in the fall of 2015 for this purpose: to give playwrights the chance to develop new work and to expose the Town and County community to this wonderful and exciting process. *A Reunion of Sorts* last summer was the first entry into this program. The One Acts this spring, further that program, giving emerging directors the opportunity to work on new plays. It's a different process for all involved. There's no set blueprint to follow, no previous productions to reference. It's all new and hopefully for everyone involved, all terribly exciting.

A New Play Committee read numerous submissions this winter and narrowed down the plays to their top choices. The directors were then presented with these choices and made their final decisions. Once this process had been completed, the directors learned who their playwrights were and introductions were made. It seems fitting that in our 70th Anniversary Season, Town and Country Players continues to grow and expand. We are not only adding new directors to our ranks, but now including the playwright as part of our ever growing community.

T&C INSIGHTS

A Note from Jim Moore, Director of Imaginary Friends

The less I know about a work of theatre when I sit down to view it, the more I enjoy it. I'm at the point where I stay out of the director's note section of the program all together. Not you though. You're bold. The play you are about to watch is the pivotal moment of truth in a theatrical experiment. The Signature Series of Town and Country Players has paired debuting directors, such as myself, with brand new plays: another bold decision. If that somehow wasn't enough, this production also features debuts at producer, stage manager, costume design and lighting design. I proudly present Jeffrey James Keyes' *Imaginary Friends* by way of this most unique process. This play doubles down on the overall production's theme of unconventionality, and I've loved watching my vision take shape these past few weeks. I found this piece to be incredibly challenging in the most wonderful of ways, and I'm indebted to my talented cast, production team and all of the production's mentors. Please enjoy our "harmless product of overactive imaginations".

A Note from Paul Waldowski, Director of Destiny is a Careless Waiter

Theater life began for me quite accidentally....my wife, Meg asked me to attend an audition for "Guys and Dolls" to give her some feedback. Upon arriving we learned they were "closed auditions". After good natured prodding became more serious pleading, I, myself, auditioned and learned two days later, that I was cast as "Big Jule". The bug had bitten! Over the next several years, I became the comic relief, the funny sidekick with 2nd banana type roles, way beyond my meager initial expectations...Ali Hakim in Oklahoma, Moonface Martin in Anything Goes, Bun Foo in Thoroughly Modern...a minor league acting career was born. I began to seriously start looking at actors and choices and director intervention...why were they cast, could that scene have played differently, why did those two have no chemistry? Which led me to submitting to direct a One Act here at Town and Country Players. I am enormously pleased at the 4 cast members who will share their skills in "Destiny", a show which helps define just how difficult relationships are. It is our conjoined hope, that you will leave with a smile and say, "that was a fun night" here at T & C's One Acts.

T&C INSIGHTS

A Note from Susan Galli, Director of Honky Tonk Queen

With the ink on my BA diploma in Theater barely dry, I bought a one-way ticket to the US Virgin Islands to embark on a working tour around the world. As any good theater major knows, you should minor in bartending or waitressing as a backup plan. My first job in Saint Thomas was as a bartender at The Virgin's Oar House. Serving Pina Coladas and Strawberry Daiquiris to the visiting cruise ship patrons by day and serving beer and shots of tequila to the locals at night. What the cruise guests didn't realize when they drank at that The VOA, was that they were actually drinking at one of the best dive bar for locals on the island. I loved my time at that dive bar. Reading Honky Tonk Queen immediately brought back memories of the characters I met and worked with while at The VOA. The actors in this production and I loved working on this play. Rob Rosiello has crafted a one act similar to a classic Country song, telling a complete and rich story with brevity, nuance, and simplicity. It has been a joy and pleasure from start to finish.

A Note from Carly Price, Director of Direct Intervention

I am honored to be able to direct an original one act play here at Town and Country Players. I first auditioned for a show here in 2013, after 7 years of being away from the theater. I was cast as Poopsie in The Pajama Game and I felt an immediate affinity for that cast, crew, and this theater, 4 years later, and I am now the VP of Membership, I have learned so much in these past 4 years here both onstage and backstage. It seemed only natural that my next venture would be directing, and I could not think of a more perfect place to direct than my second home. I was especially excited that I would get to direct an original work, and I knew that I had to be the one to direct this particular play. When I first read this script, I immediately identified with Katie and her journey. I believe we have all had that moment of self-doubt as we are about to take a big risk or make a big decision. Is this the right thing to do? Am I making a big mistake? Am I good enough to be a director? We don't usually have a guardian angel step in to tell us the answer. We have to look inward and trust ourselves and trust our talents. It isn't an easy thing to do and it takes a lot of courage. I hope that this one-act shines a light on the importance of listening to your instincts and, ultimately, believing in yourself.

OUR 70TH SEASON SILENT AUCTION


This season, in addition to our "70 for 70" fundraiser, T&C will be hosting a Silent Auction during the opening night of each of our main stage productions.






