

T&C INSIGHTS

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

At the age of about eight years old, in a public school in Brooklyn, NY, I was introduced to a unique event in my education: a Spelling Bee. In those days, it was one of the few "games" that would remove you from sitting at your desk and taking notes or practicing cursive writing. I remember being about fourth in line at the room's radiators, right under the huge windows. Heart beating very fast, hands unable to be still, I didn't even think of winning; I just didn't want to be out on the first round. Then came THE WORD: alfabet (my computer keeps Autocorrecting it...even a machine knows how to spell it...). How Humiliating! Out on the first round! Luckily, in my "other," non-director's life, I became a high school English Teacher and Chairperson... shows how a Spelling Bee can influence one's life.

As for the pedigree of the wonderful musical you are about to view today, on July 6th of this year, the original cast reunited for a 10th Anniversary of *Spelling Bee* in Los Angeles. Every one of the cast members considers the others "life-long friends," and many of them have gone on to become fixtures on television shows and in movies (i.e.; Jesse Tyler Ferguson [Leaf Coneybear] on "Modern Family"). The show was originally penned by Sarah Saltzberg with a tiny theatrical group in the Berkshires, MA. Saltzberg was Wendy Wasserstein's, the Tony-Award winning playwright's, nanny. Wasserstein paired the performing team with some NYC playwrights, and the play began a run for three months at Off-Broadway's Second Stage Theatre Company. The reviews were so good, that in 2005, *Spelling Bee* was moved to Circle in the Square on Broadway, where it opened just under the deadline for the Tony's. It was nominated for six and won two: one for Original Book and one for Best Actor, Dan Fogler playing the character of William Barfee. Since it has been opened to worldwide performance, it has generated over 3000 productions worldwide.

So, today, this director and a marvelous cast and crew are offering you a musical where you can volunteer to be a cast member, and win the Spelling Bee that you, too, may have lost at age 8. When the original Broadway cast was asked their best memories about this musical, they stated that their favorite moments of the show "were unplanned and unscripted." They dealt with David Hasselhoff's 15 mins. of stand-up comedy; a "wasted" woman dragged from the theatre shouting answers... incorrectly; and a man who jumped on the stage because he claimed he spelled every word as correctly as did the "champ" of the evening...NOT. Each performance of this show is unique and different and our cast has prepared to deal with...YOU as a Speller.


