A Note from the Author

In 1843, at the age of 31, Charles Dickens embarked on the ambitious task of writing a holiday novella complete with illustration in approximately 6 weeks, to be ready for publication the week before Christmas. What resulted was an instant classic, whose first edition sold out in under a week, and whose legacy cannot be overstated. One hundred and seventy-five years later, at the same age, I have endeavored in an even shorter time frame to write an adaptation with musical numbers that will do justice to a timeless and beloved story.

My adaptation of A Christmas Carol as a theater piece is just one in a long line —Dickens himself performed public dramatic readings of the story until the year he died. Setting the story within a performance is also not a new concept —the Bill Murray movie Scrooged may have been mentioned in my pitch of this as a holiday show concept. Every person can likely name their favorite movie or stage adaptation. For me, I grew up watching the various movie adaptations, particularly the Muppet Christmas Carol and the Alastair Sim classic, which were the only accepted versions in our house, aside from the Mickey Mouse version, of course. The story is universally known and adaptations continue to appear and likely will in perpetuity.

Why does this particular story have such an enduring legacy? For Dickens, the story was personal—like most of his novels, character inspiration came from his own interaction with the poor, the handicapped, and the lonely, within London, within his own family and likely in this instance, within himself. For me, it has a personal connection. The message of the connective power of theater and the redemptive power of hope, belief, and love we witness in this show comes from my personal experience in ten seasons at Town and Country. What we see in whatever version we choose are the themes that linger from the original—the spirit of giving, the importance of family, our connectedness and duty to our fellow man, and most importantly, the ability of humans to change.

Dickens' preface states, "I have endeavoured in this Ghostly little book, to raise the Ghost of an Idea, which shall not put my readers out of humour with themselves, with each other, with the season, or with me. May it haunt their houses pleasantly." I don't believe we could ask for any better—may you honour the holiday spirit in your heart and try to keep it all the year.




