MUSIC USED IN THIS PRODUCTION

THE MUSIC IN THE LARAMIE PROJECT.

There are many points of amazing extremes thrown together in *The Laramie Project*: The beauty of the terrain and the savage nature of the crime committed there; the progressive environment of the university and the working class community within which it resides; the welcoming nature of some residents and the all too often "us vs. them" mentality held by others.

The people of Laramie are as complex, beautiful and raw as the landscape that surrounds them. Their stories deserve an equally dynamic and complex audio soundtrack to underscore and highlight a town thrown into chaos but ultimately striving to survive.

The music used within our production of *The Laramie Project* celebrates this diversity. The preshow and intermission music offer a wide range of popular music from the 1998-1999 time period in which the show is set. Pop icons Madonna and Cher had huge hit albums in that period, along with power ballads by Celine Dion and Faith Hill, among so many others.

During the show, more classical and traditional music is featured to underscore transitions and pivotal moments, ranging from variations on well-known religious hymns to selections from a Grammy Award Nominated album, Considering *Matthew Shepard*. CraigHella Johnson's choral piece is in the style and tradition of Bach's *Passions*, the later often used for Easter liturgies. *Considering Matthew Shepard* is a powerful piece of music that tells the story of Matthew Shepard from all vantage points, from those who loved him to those who protested him to the very fence that held him. The music used at various times for various moods creates a feeling that supports and enhances the storytelling of the playwrights and our amazing cast. It is also our hope that this audio tapestry gives you, the audience, an even richer and more textured experience that we hope will linger long after the final moments of the show shine from our Town and Country Players' stage.



A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

T& C INSIGHTS

A NOTE FROM THE DRAMATURG

I have truly been humbled and honored to contribute to the research for Town & Country's incredibly timely production of The Laramie Project and to help bring the director, production team and actors' visions to life through research. The dramaturg of a show helps fulfill the vision of the director and design team by uncovering the history surrounding the event(s) a play explores as well as the era. The Laramie Project demands authenticity and attendance to the events and history of both The production and the incredibly important and history changing people etched out on the stage. To be a part of this production, I can't say thank you enough.

In the spring of 1999, I was a freshman in college in New York City, studying theatre and ushering for as many shows so I could go see as many shows as I could for free. The one that had my heart that spring was The Laramie Project by Moisés Kaufman. I just had to see it. The play was about celebrating and remembering Matthew Shepard. It was about never forgetting and it was about empowerment. Moisés Kaufman was a playwright of the moment for me. I fell in love with Mr Kaufman's latest play, Gross Indecency: The Three Trials of Oscar Wilde, memorizing for an acting piece the year before. Moisés understands how to poeticize human injustice. The beauty that he painted into the words of Oscar Wilde; I knew he would do Matthew justice.

I was just 19 years old. Matthew would have been almost 22. The political and social landscape of 1998 was horrifying. 1999 brought intense sorrow and shock, as well, in the wake of the Columbine High School Shooting. The year 2000 was one of empowerment. And that's exactly how The Laramie Project felt. The stark set and pointedly pulled together costuming told you this show was different. This show was about reality not fantasy. This show was there because a very urgent reality needed to be shared, one without pretense, without comfort zones. The actors played in front and below a very domineering fence that doubled as a media screen. It gave the feeling of a rural country road bill board or your large screen at home. At times you were pulled in by reels of media footage and pops of landscape. That put you there in 1998, in Laramie, in your home, in the theatre with the actors telling you the story of this amazing human, the town's forgivable normally and the perpetrators' unforgivable crimes.

The timing of this is important. It will be the 19th anniversary of Matthew being murdered. The 17th anniversary of this production. In these 17 years I have had the opportunity to live practically two of my 19 year old self's lifetimes. Just think how much Matthew could have accomplished. I was never the same after seeing the Laramie Project. Theatre had more tools in its tool kit after that. Heros were touchable and every story had a stage. I knew theatre was important before The Laramie Project. I came to know theatre is essential after The Laramie Project. Thank you all for bringing this production to life! A special thanks to Rob Rosiello and Nancy Ridgeway for giving me the chance to take a step into the production team!
