T&C INSIGHTS...

A NOTE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The Signature Series at Town and Country Players was created in the fall of 2015 as an umbrella program for all levels of new play development. Having lived in NYC for nearly a decade and as a playwright myself, I was very used to being exposed to new and developing works. Moving outside NYC, I realized many don't get to experience the excitement of this first hand, and it was something we could and should easily bring to our audience of both artists and patrons. The first production that fell under this new program was the World Premiere of Jerry Lacy's play, *A Reunion of Sorts*. This was followed in 2017 by four new one acts as part of our biennial One Act Festival. Award-winning playwright Michael Hollinger led a sold-out Playwriting Workshop in the winter of 2018, and three new full length plays received staged readings that winter, as well.

June 2019 has been designated as "Signature Series Month," with this one act festival of original plays and the world premiere of the full-length drama, *Cold Stun.*

This particular festival that you will see this weekend began with a call for submissions in the Summer of 2018. 160 plays from around the country poured in with such sudden gusto that we ended the submission window early so as to properly manage and read the submissions that we initially received. The 2018 New Play Committee was comprised of five Town and Country Members: Laurel Carr, Dr. Caity Logan, John Neuman, Nancy Ridgeway, and Meg Waldowski. They spent several months reading all submissions before narrowing down the list to the five you will see this evening.

This festival has been a long-standing method to bring in new directors to the Town and Country Community, often drawing from within our own membership. The directors get the chance to experience all aspects of the directing process. Many people ask- what does a director do, other than tell actors where to stand and when they enter/exit? The experience includes so very much more, even with short plays like these. They get to experience the excitement of the audition process from the other side of the table, the promise of what can be at the first read through, then the journey of collaboration and discovery that is the rehearsal process. They also get to work with designers on the technical aspects of the show so that they can fully realize the vision they have worked so hard to create.

This is my fourth one act festival at Town and Country Players. The first one I was a mere spectator. The second I was the stage manager, and then had the good fortune to have one of my plays be part of the 2017 Festival. Now as the Executive Director of the 2019 Festival, I am thrilled to present five hilarious new plays, with some of the best talent from within our Town and Country Community both on stage and behind the scenes, and five wonderful new directors whose labors of love will hopefully leave you wanting more from these gifted and visionary artists.

A Note from Jessica Briggs, Director of Emma Abridged

Emma Abridged holds a special place in my heart - it is not only my favorite Jane Austen novel, but it is the first play I have had the opportunity to direct. The experience of directing these five brilliant actors has been nothing short of thrilling. One of the qualities that drew me to directing this play was the chance to tell the story of a 350+ page novel in fifteen minutes— a challenge I was very excited to take on. Published over 200 years ago, Emma was the fourth and last novel published by Austen in her lifetime. While some minor characters were cut for time in this interpretation, the heart of the story is still there. Austen was, after all, a satirist, and this version of Emma certainly reflects that. My absolute favorite moment in the entire novel, when Emma and Knightley make an important, lifechanging discovery, was captured perfectly in this play. I found myself feeling gutted one moment, and then laughing the very next. With these five brilliant actors bringing ten characters to life, it has been such a joy helping them find those little moments of magic within the play. I could not have chosen a more talented cast. Thank you for taking this journey through *Emma*'s little world with us. We hope you enjoy your time in Highbury!

A Note from Breffny Rouse, Director of Standing Tall

What a thrill to direct Nancy Frick's Standing Tall. A clever and intelligent piece about the incredible synergy and joy of women's lifelong friendships. I am thankful for Rob and Nancy allowing me to bring my vision to stage, to Kelli for putting these thoughts to paper, to my cast for their passion, to my wife for allowing me to pursue this time-consuming hobby, and to God for everything. This is the best day of my life!

A Note from Paul Waldowski, Director of Wish My Ego Well

Wish My Ego Well, is my second trip as a One Acts director and the one thing that I feel stands out more than anything is that I am hugely more comfortable with giving direction to the cast as well as listening to their input for other ideas; the blocking feels more natural....if after a few runs, it doesn't feel right, we have adapted. I feel a real sense of bonding with the actor/characters as we develop how they each want to be seen on stage. My cast of three in *Wish My Ego Well* has been wonderful, receptive...creative...and funny. I think they have developed great choices for our show. I am proud of their effort and happy to have such talented people to work with. Onward and upward!

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
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T&C Raffle
